Everything went wrong this past week
—and yet everything ended up all right
for the stock market.

On the surface, it doesn't look like much happened. The Dow Jones Industrial Average advanced 83.81 points, or 0.2%, to 34,870.16, while the S&P 500 rose 0.4%, to 4369.55, and the Nasdaq Composite gained 0.4%, to 14,701.92. The indexes even managed to finish the

week at record highs. It's exactly the kind of action we'd expect from a holiday-shortened trading week—except that it wasn't.
