Services Growth Slows, Reaches Lowest Level in **About 2 Years**

The Institute for Supply Management's Non-Manufacturing Purchasing Managers Index, a key gauge of services activity, came in at 55.3 for June, a 0.6 percentage point drop from

the May reading of 55.9 and the lowest reading since May 2020.

A number above 50 still indicates that the service sector is expanding, and the reading even topped the consensus for 54.5, but growth clearly ticked down last month.

The manufacturing sector also witnessed a slowdown in growth last month. Last week, the ISM reported a deceleration in June to 53.0, down from 56.1 in May, its slowest pace since June 2020.
