# The best places to live in North America

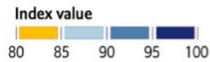
OVER 630,000 people moved to North America from other parts of the world in the first half of 2022, a rise of 51% from the same period a year earlier. It is easy to see why. The region is home to some of the world's most "liveable" cities, according to an index by EIU, our sister company. It ranks living conditions in 172 cities around the world, taking into account more than 30 factors related to education, culture, the environment, health care, infrastructure and stability. This year, every city in North America included in the index scored above 80 (out of 100), with an average of 88. That makes North America the second-most "liveable" region in the world, narrowly behind Western Europe. Which of its cities stood

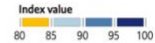
